Our 2015 Waterworks System Assessment (WSA3) report recommended that \$650,000 be spent on improvements to the water treatment plant. The Town upgraded the electrical requirements in 2016 and mechanical upgrades in 2019. The report also estimates that, within the next twenty to sixty years, a total of \$6,400,000 in capital investment will be required for the Town's water system.

Reserve Accounts

The amount of 2022 utility revenue transferred into to the Utility Reserve account was \$38,420.03. Note that this amount is included in the revenue above but should amounts be used for capital expenses, it is not taken out in the expenditures b/c it would be moved to assets.

2022 was a succession planning year with an employee being hired to replace the foreman Both of these employees' wages were put to Water & Utility In 2023 there will only be the one wage again.

In our 2022 fiscal year, the Gas Tax Fund only paid out one of the two payments. We were to receive another \$26,636, which we had budgeted for

Every year we add the infrastructure fees to the Utility Reserve Account, which will In 2022 \$38,420.03 plus interest of \$1,879.02 put the total to **\$221,969.98** be used to provide water and sewer system capital infrastructure

In 2019 \$150,000 from the Utility Reserve was used for the mechanical upgrades to the Water Treatment Plant.
