On December 17th, the Sr. Blues Hockey Team hosted the Hockey Night of Hope, a fundraising event for the Porcupine Hope Fund. The Sr. Blues weren't able to come out with a win against the Tisdale Ramblers, but the crowd made up for it with big time dollars being raised for the Hope Fund. Congratulations to Shootout Winner, Nelson Shumlanski, and to the Top Goaltender in the competition, Tim Irving, who allowed only one goal to sneak past him.

The fundraiser itself was a huge success, raising a total of \$20,488.75! Thanks to all who came out to support the event, to the Sr. Blues players, and to everyone else who volunteered their time to make the night happen.

The Porcupine Hope Fund is a newly established charitable fund within the Porcupine Plain Healthcare Auxiliary. The Hope Fund will provide financial support for local individuals that are receiving ongoing treatment for a critical illness. This Fund was created to confidentially help those that must spend repeatedly on travel and accommodations in order to treat a critical illness. When someone in our community is sick, we often ask how we can help; this fund will act as a way to alleviate just a small part of their burden. If you would like to donate, all donations can be made to the Porcupine Hope Fund; any donations over \$25 are eligible for a charitable tax receipt.



Do not place garbage or other non-recyclable items in your blue recycle bin. Refer to the list of recyclable and non-recyclable items (*below*) if you are uncertain about what can and cannot be placed in your blue bin. Space is required for the truck to pick up your bins; when placing bins on street, leave room for pickup. Do not place your bin close to another bin or beside a vehicle. In order for your garbage or recycling to be picked up by the Greenland truck, your items must be neatly **INSIDE** the bin, with the lid **CLOSED**. You **CANNOT** have bags on top of the bin or beside it. The driver does not get out to physically toss the garbage into the truck. Your bin will not be picked up/dumped if there is garbage on the lid.

THESE ITEMS CAN BE PLACED IN YOUR **BLUE** BIN OR IN THE RECYCLE BINS LOCATED AT THE PORCUPINE TRANSFER STATION
OPEN TUES, THUR & SAT 8A.M.-5P.M.

- ⇒ CARDBOARD, BOXBOARD, OFFICE PAPER, NEWSPRINT, JUNK MAIL & CATALOGS
- ⇒ PLASTIC CONTAINERS, MILK CARTONS & PLASTIC MILK JUGS (*plastics numbered 2 through 7 - must be clean!*)
- ⇒ TIN & ALUMINUM CANS (*must be clean, with or without labels*)

Kitchen: Milk jugs, Milk cartons, Creamer cartons & bottles, Paper egg cartons, Soup/Vegetable/other food cans, Aluminum & tin cans, Pie tins, Plastic juice bottles, Yogurt & salad dressing containers, Cereal boxes, Cardboard boxes (unsoiled)
Bathroom: Body wash, Shampoo & Conditioner bottles, Plastic hairspray & shaving bottles, Toilet paper cones, Tissue boxes, Plastic pill bottles
Office: Office paper, Catalogs, Phone books, Sticky notes, Scrap paper, Cardboard boxes (flattened)
Laundry: Laundry soap containers, Spot remover bottles, Bleach containers

ALL ITEMS MUST BE CLEAN!

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING:

SNOWMOBILE SAFETY WEEK IS JANUARY 15-21, 2023

During Snowmobile Safety week, take time to focus on best practices and safe riding habits, and pass them along to new riders, whether it's family or friends.

- Never consume alcohol or drugs before or during snowmobiling.
- Check condition of your snowmobile clothing and ensure you have adequate accessories for warmth.
- Stay on the trail unless you have express permission from landowners and do not snowmobile in Town parks/playgrounds. There may be items under the snow that can damage your snowmobile.
- Know and use correct hand signals and learn the language of snowmobile trail signage.
- Obey all trail signs, markers, and speed limits. Always operate at safe and reasonable speeds.
- Be extremely cautious on all bodies of water.
- Make sure your sled fits you — can you start and lift it on your own? Can you maneuver it easily? Is it comfortable? Become familiar with the snowmobile and get a feel for the throttle and handling before hitting the trail at full speed.
- Service your sled for maintenance and repair. Check your belt, track, oil, grease, change old fuel, ensure tail and headlights are working, and place reflective material on sled for night riding.

- Make sure there is enough snow cover to ensure your sled is getting enough lubrication.
- Put together a safety kit and store in the trunk of your sled, including a tow rope, first aid kit, survival food, spark plugs, and extra snowmobile belt.
- Obtain a snowmobile trail map of the area and plan your ride. Tell someone where you are going so they can find you if you're in trouble.
- Learn safe snowmobiling. It's mandatory for all riders born January 1, 1989 or

WHAT TO WEAR:

- * Wear approved snowmobile helmet with face shield, with no cracks. Open-face and closed-face helmets are available. Electric face shields will not fog.
- * Wear a balaclava (nylon, fleece, wool), snowmobile gloves, mitts, pants, jacket or one-piece snowmobile suit, boots and heavy outdoor socks. Buy the warmest gear available!
- * Ensure that the back of your jacket has reflective material and place a reflective decal on the back of your helmet. This will help the person following you to have sight of you at all times at night.
- * Wear a wrist mirror. This is an excellent safety device which enables you to check behind you without turning your body and causing your sled to
