The afternoon began with opening remarks by Eastern Region II's Director, Minister Brent Digness, and an opening prayer from Elder Margaret Harrison with ERII's Elders Branch. Both Minister Digness and Town of Porcupine Plain Mayor, Nick Wood, spoke to the issue of Truth & Reconciliation and the steps being taken in our community. Mayor Wood thanked Minister Digness for his leadership in building a strong friendship between local governments and the Métis Nation. 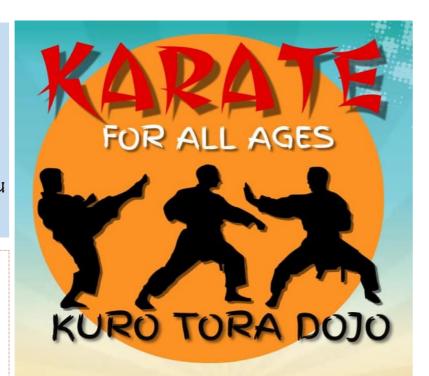

The Porcupine Plain & District Volunteer Fire Department is celebrating Fire Prevention Week October 8th to 14th. This year's campaign — Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention. — works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take when cooking to keep themselves and those around them safe.

Cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries; unattended cooking is the leading cause of cooking fires and deaths. A cooking fire can grow quickly, damaging homes and injuring people, which can easily be prevented. The PP Fire Department encourages all residents to embrace the 2023 Fire Prevention Week theme and offers these key safety tips to help reduce the risk of a cooking fire:

- 1. Watch what you heat. Always keep a close eye on what you are cooking. Set a timer to remind you that you are cooking.
- 2. Turn pot handles toward the back of the stove. Always keep a lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan and turn off the burner.
- 3. Have a "kid- and pet-free zone" of at least 3 feet (1 meter) around the stove or grill and anywhere else hot food or drink is prepared or carried.

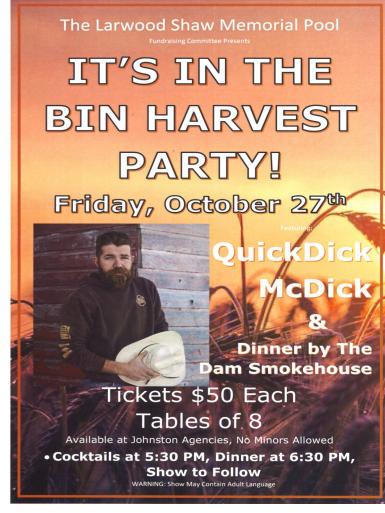
