With the Christmas season fast approaching may you embrace the beauty and true meaning of the season.

As the year draws to a close, I would like to take the opportunity to thank you for your friendship and support.

On Wednesday, November 15th, the Porcupine Plain Provider Team & RCMP hosted Cpl. Myron Hleck with Saskatchewan's Trafficking Response Team as he presented an information session on *Human Trafficking, Labour Trafficking & Internet Safety.* Hleck noted that one of the main ways individuals have been targeted recently has been through the internet; they often target "vulnerable" individuals (those who are bullied, loners, have an unhappy home life, etc.), seeking out targets on social media, at teen hangouts, schools, malls, and courthouses.

According to the Canadian Centre to End Human Trafficking, some warning signs that someone may be a victim of human trafficking include the following:

- Not being allowed to contact family or friends; isolated & secluded
- Being controlled and watched by others, driven to/from locations, escorted at all times, having someone speak for them in public
- Not having a passport or other forms of I.D. in their possession
- Not having control of their own money or cellphone; may have more than one cellphone in their possession
- Lying about age/false ID
- Providing scripted or rehearsed answers to casual questions
- Show signs of a controlling/abusive relationship (acting in a fearful, anxious, submissive or nervous manner; excessive concern about displeasing partner/employer)
- Fearful of law enforcement or immigration services

Other signs of Labour Trafficking might include poor work and living conditions, no work permit or employment contract, being paid under the table, or being paid lower than minimum wage.

Because traffickers and other predators are using Facebook, Twitter, Snapchak, Instagram, TickTok, etc. to target youth, the Canadian Centre to End Human Trafficking recommends that parents speak candidly to their children about potential risks and insist on knowing the passwords to all electronic devices their kids use. Parents should also be able to recognize the warning signs that your child might be being trafficked (including, but not limited to, having an older controlling boyfriend, dressing provocatively, staying out late, skipping school/meals, carrying false I.D., having more than one cell phone, unexplainable expensive new items, becoming secretive, etc.)

If you are a victim/survivor of forced prostitution or forced labour, or believe someone else might be, call the Canadian Human Trafficking Hotline at 1-833-900-1010. If you are concerned about your own or others' working conditions, reach out to Employment Standards, OH&S, Immigration, Foreign Workers Recruitment or Immigration Services.




