Do not place garbage or other non-recyclable items in your blue recycle bin. Refer to the list of recyclable and non-recyclable items below. IF YOU ARE UNCERTAIN IF AN ITEM IS RECYCLABLE, ERR ON THE SIDE OF CAUTION AND THROW IT IN THE GARBAGE! The ENTIRE TRUCK LOAD will be REJECTED if there is even one non-recyclable item in the load.

Space is required for the truck to pick up your bins; when placing bins on street, leave room for pickup. Do not place your bin close to another bin or beside a vehicle. In order for your garbage or recycling to be picked up by the Greenland truck, your items must be neatly INSIDE the bin, with the lid CLOSED. You CANNOT have bags on top of the bin or beside it. The driver does not get out to physically toss the garbage into the truck. Your bin will not be picked up/dumped if there is garbage on the lid.

THESE ITEMS CAN BE PLACED IN YOUR BLUE BIN OR RECYCLE BINS AT PORCUPINE TRANSFER STATION OPEN TUES, THUR & SAT 8A.M.-5P.M.

- ⇒ CARDBOARD, BOXBOARD, OFFICE PAPER, NEWSPRINT, JUNK MAIL & CATALOGS
- ⇒ PLASTIC CONTAINERS, MILK CARTONS & PLASTIC MILK JUGS (plastics numbered 2 through 7 - must be clean!)
- ⇒ TIN & ALUMINUM CANS (must be clean, with or without labels)

Kitchen: Milk jugs, Milk cartons, Creamer cartons & bottles, Paper egg cartons, Soup/Vegetable/other food cans, Aluminum & tin cans, Pie tins, Plastic juice bottles, Yogurt & salad dressing containers, Cereal boxes, Cardboard boxes (unsoiled)

Bathroom: Body wash, Shampoo & Conditioner bottles, Plastic hairspray & shaving bottles, Toilet paper cones, Tissue boxes, Plastic pill bottles

Office: Office paper, Catalogs, Phone books, Sticky notes, Scrap paper, Cardboard boxes (flattened)

Laundry: Laundry soap containers, Spot remover bottles, Bleach containers

ALL ITEMS MUST BE CLEAN!

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING:
Plastic grocery/shopping bags, Glass, Plastic wrap, Single-use plastic containers (clamshells, etc.), Styrofoam, Ceramics, Light bulbs, Soiled cardboard (including pizza boxes), Pet food bags, Hazardous chemical containers, Scrap metal/wood/wire, Car parts, Plastic toys, Household garbage.

NO FOOD CONTAINERS LABELED #1
Glass jars and bottles can be taken to SARCAN; Yard waste (grass, leaves, branches, etc.) can be hauled to Town Compost Site; Scrap Metal can be taken to Ecklund Enterprises; All other waste can be disposed of in brown bins or at Porcupine Transfer Station.

ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH 100TH ANNIVERSARY

St. Andrew's Church marked its 100th anniversary on July 29th with a joyous celebration. The church service was officiated by Nancy Steinbachs, with special guests including former minister Tom Morgan and Rev. Alex Parsons from the Saskatoon Synod. Gary Reed shared a captivating 100-year history of the church, while Ray Zimmerman and Debbie Gibson provided musical entertainment for the afternoon. The event concluded with a large potluck lunch. Approximately 100 people attended, making it a perfect celebration.

Now a historic site, St. Andrew's Church was built in the Shand Creek area in 1924 by returned soldier settlers and pioneers of the area, holding its first service on May 18, 1924. A cairn and plaque erected by the Shand Agricultural Society commemorates the pioneers who built the church, along with the original Red Cross Outpost.

The cars were a portion of a midway that was purchased, in used condition, in the early 1960s by the Porcupine Plain Lions Club. For many years, the midway traveled to Nipawin, Hudson Bay, Weekes, Tisdale, Henchcliff, and the Central Hall Shand Fair. The car rides entertained youngsters for decades, more recently forming an integral part of our community's annual Quilly Willy Sports Days, until their retirement in 2024.
