

The truck picks up recycling and takes it to a depot and, if even one cart contains a non-recyclable item, the entire load is contaminated and will be rejected by the depot!

Please be diligent and do not put any garbage in your blue recycle bin. It defeats the purpose of others recycling if even one bin is contaminated. If this continues to occur, the community could be removed from the recycling program.

If you are unsure if an item is recyclable, be safe and put it in the garbage bin so you are not contaminating an entire load of recycling.
