HOLIDAY TREE LIGHTING 2025

On Thursday, November 27th, Johnston Agencies hosted the 12th Annual Tree Lighting Ceremony. In a surprising twist from tradition, temperatures hovered around a balmy -10°C instead of the usual -25°C deep freeze we've come to expect!

Sharing the evening with Late Night Shopping, Bob Nicholson, long-standing Master of Ceremonies, encouraged everyone to support the businesses that support our community year-round, A heartfelt thank you to everyone who contributed to the success Walmart when it comes to donations."

Bob carried on his tradition of delightfully corny dad jokes, but this year arrived with something extra: his Roughrider jersey and a story of heroic holiday determination. He launched into his Grey Cup tale — a quest to ask Santa for a Riders win. What started as a simple wish turned into an adventure in Winnipeg. Amber Hoffus of Johnston Agencies, event sponsor, then expressed thanks to those who made the night possible and shared how meaningful the Caring Hearts team's work has been for her own grandmother in the Nursing Home. She reflected on

a conversation they had years ago — that the things on our wish lists fade quickly, but the memories we make with loved ones last forever. Amber closed with a message for all of us: "Make memories, not perfection — because that's what really matters."

The bonfire crackled, cookies and cocoa were enjoyed, families cuddled together on a sparkle-tour wagon ride through town, and the community made new memories to carry into the season.


