**PP Athletes Making Waves!**

The past few months have been packed with milestones for local athletes, past and present, who continue to put our community on the map.

Leading the way, hometown hockey legend Kelly Chase was named one of the first-ever inductees into the Saskatoon Blades Hall of Fame. Honoured during the March 21 game, the recognition celebrates both his time with the Blades and a gritty career that carried him all the way to the NHL.

Another familiar name, Colette Bourgonje, was inducted into the Canada Games Hall of Honour on March 26 in Quebec City. Best known as a decorated Paralympian, Bourgonje is now being recognized for her impact as a coach, mentoring and developing athletes.

The next generation is keeping the momentum going! Porcupine native Tarin Smith etched his name into the WHL's record books as the all-time leading scorer among defencemen for the Everett Silvertips and was recently named to the WHL Western Conference Second All-Star Team!

Parker Belchamber also had an outstanding 2025-26 skating season, consistently finishing at the top of the podium and earning a spot at

the 2026 Saskatchewan Winter Games with Team Lakeland. She capped off her season with a gold medal performance in Meadow Lake and followed it up by winning the Star 5 Freeski provincial title in Swift Current against a field of over 30 skaters.

On the court, the PPCS Bears senior girls and boys basketball teams both earned their way to HOOPLA! The girls battled hard to bring home bronze, while the boys continued their dominant run—making it four straight appearances and capturing their second consecutive gold medal.

It's not just athletes—local performers are shining too! The PP School of Dance recently competed in Wadena, where the senior lyrical group took home top honours for choreography and won Best Group in the Dance Off! The School of Dance is now gearing up for another competition in Tisdale in April, followed by their year-end recital on April 25.

And in martial arts, Kuro Tora Dojo had a standout showing at a tournament in Zenon Park, with seven competitors bringing home an impressive 16 medals!

From the rink to the stage, and everywhere in between, Porcupine Plain continues to prove that small-town roots can lead to big achievements.

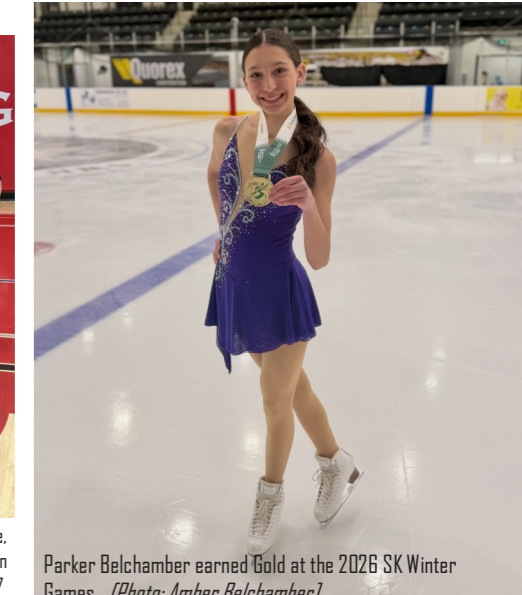

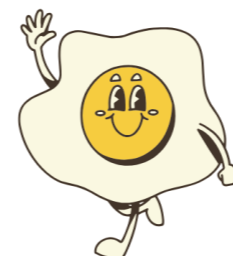

**YOUR BLUE RECYCLE BINS**

Do not place garbage or other non-recyclable items in your blue recycle bin. Refer to the list of recyclable and non-recyclable items below. IF YOU ARE UNCERTAIN IF AN ITEM IS RECYCLABLE, ERR ON THE SIDE OF CAUTION AND THROW IT IN THE GARBAGE! The ENTIRE TRUCK LOAD will be REJECTED if there is even one non-recyclable item in the load. Space is required for the truck to pick up your bins; when placing bins on street, leave room for pickup. Do not place your bin close to another bin or beside a vehicle. In order for your garbage or recycling to be picked up by the Greenland truck, your items must be neatly INSIDE the bin, with the lid CLOSED. You CANNOT have bags on top of the bin or beside it. The driver will not get out to toss garbage into the truck. Your bin will not be picked up/dumped if there is garbage on the lid.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS CAN BE PLACED IN YOUR BLUE BIN OR IN THE RECYCLE BINS LOCATED AT THE PORCUPINE TRANSFER STATION OPEN TUES, THUR & SAT 8A.M.-5P.M.

- Paper & Cardboard:**

  - Phone Books, paper (not tied in bundles), paper bags
  - Newspapers, letters, envelopes (incl. window), greeting cards, non-foil gift wrap, paper gift bags
  - Milk & juice cartons
  - Egg cartons
  - Magazines, brochures, catalogs (remove plastic wrap)
  - Paper drinking cups, soup containers (no foam)
  - Bagged shredded paper
- Plastics #2-7:**
  - Shampoo, conditioner bottles
  - Plastic clamshell trays
  - Plastic bottles
  - Milk jugs
  - Laundry detergent & softener jugs
  - Plastic bags, clean plastic wrap & bubble wrap (bundle into one plastic bag, tie closed)
  - Yogurt & margarine containers, plastic cups
- Tin & Aluminum:**
  - CLEAN metal & aluminum cans, lids
  - CLEAN Trays, plates
- REMOVE LIDS & CAPS**
- CLEAN OFF FOOD RESIDUE**
- LABELS CAN BE LEFT ON**
