PP MUSEUM CELEBRATES 50 YEARS

The museum began in 1968-69, when Harry & Margaret Salmond opened a "Curiosity Shop" on their farm to display their growing collection of historical artifacts and antiques from the area. The Salmond family donated their treasures to create a museum and, on June 6, 1976, the Porcupine Plain & District Museum officially opened. Located in the former hospital building on Windsor Avenue, and now a designated Heritage Site, the Museum contains thousands of artifacts that tell the story of the region's settlers. Exhibits include a soldier settlement, hospital artifacts from the early days of local healthcare, agricultural machinery and transportation exhibits, an authentic lace collection and old time fashion displays, and an extensive bird collection featuring species from Porcupine Plain, Chelan, and Somme areas. The Museum continues to collect donations from local families to showcase the stories of the area.

Recently, the Board has been working to improve accessibility to, installing sidewalks in the backyard and ramps to the outbuildings; they are currently fundraising to purchase a stairlift for inside the main building. The current fundraiser is a raffle for a beautiful quilt generously donated by Irene Picray. Tickets are available at the Museum, Affinity Credit Union, Town Office, or by contacting any Board member.

The Museum is now open for the season, Monday to Saturday 1:00-5:00p.m. Assistant Curators, Breanne & Kylee, have lots of plans for this summer and will be happy to give visitors a tour!

The Museum is proud to celebrate 50 years in our community and hope that you will join them at the end of August as they mark this special milestone with an anniversary celebration. The Board is accepting sponsorships to help make this event truly memorable. Stay tuned for more details and exact date in the coming weeks!

Sports Days 2026 brings Pirates & Community Spirit!

Sports days 2026 may have ended a little soggy than we hoped, but there was still plenty of fun packed into the weekend!

The morning of Saturday, June 27th kicked off with the parade which, as always, proved to be a highlight of the weekend. This year's theme - *Ahoy Matey! Pirates on the Prairies* - inspired some truly memorable floats. Taking home first place was Parkland Co-op with their hilarious "mutiny on board", featuring the kids taking over the ship, poor Susanne Cairns being forced to walk the plank, and paper mache sharks and pool-noodle kraken tentacles from the depths! Second place went to the Porcupine Opportunities Program pirate ship, where participants fully embraced the theme with pirate hats all around; even those following on bicycles joined in on the fun! Finally, third place was awarded to the Show & Shine pirate ship, featuring Craig Kriger and cousins Audriene and Rowyn dressed head-to-toe as pirates and tossing "pirate bounty" to children along the route. Their float was topped off with a customized banner featuring Quilly Willy sporting an eye patch of his own.

Also drawing plenty of attention was the Museum's float, featuring an anchor and signage - *Anchored in the Community for 50 Years* - recognizing the Museum's 50th anniversary celebration this year. Keep an eye out for announcements on that celebration, planned for the end of August.

The fun continued throughout Saturday afternoon as families enjoyed the pirate ship bouncer, balloon dome, face painting, and plenty of kids' games and prizes. Visitors could grab a bite to eat at the ever-popular burger booth, concession, and Filipino food booth, while new vendor Kate Warkentin and her Bells Coffee Truck kept everyone fueled with coffee!

Mother Nature cooperated for most of the day, allowing chariots, gymkhana, and chuckwagons to go ahead; unfortunately, rain moved in during the evening and continued throughout the night, forcing the cancellation of the fireworks. Sunday morning still saw the community gather for a pancake breakfast and Cowboy Church, but with the tracks too wet for activities to proceed safely, the difficult decision was made to cancel the remainder of Sunday's events.

YOUR BLUE RECYCLE BINS

Do not place garbage or other non-recyclable items in your blue recycle bin. Refer to the list of recyclable and non-recyclable items below. IF YOU ARE UNCERTAIN IF AN ITEM IS RECYCLABLE, ERR ON THE SIDE OF CAUTION AND THROW IT IN THE GARBAGE! The ENTIRE TRUCK LOAD will be REJECTED if there is even one non-recyclable item in the load.

Space is required for the truck to pick up your bins; when placing bins on street, leave room for pickup. Do not place your bin close to another bin or beside a vehicle. In order for your garbage or recycling to be picked up by the Greenland truck, your items must be neatly INSIDE the bin, with the lid CLOSED. You CANNOT have bags on top of the bin or beside it. The driver will not get out to toss garbage into the truck. Your bin will not be picked up/dumped if there is garbage on the lid.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS CAN BE PLACED IN YOUR BLUE BIN OR IN THE RECYCLE BINS LOCATED AT THE PORCUPINE TRANSFER STATION:

Paper & Cardboard:

- Flattened cardboard
- Phone Books, paper (not tied in bundles), paper bags
- Newspapers, letters, envelopes (incl. window), greeting cards, non-foil gift wrap, paper gift bags
- Milk & juice cartons
- Egg cartons
- Magazines, brochures, catalogs (remove plastic wrap)
- Paper drinking cups, soup containers (no foam)
- Bagged shredded paper

Plastics #2-7:

- Shampoo, conditioner bottles
- Plastic clamshell trays
- Plastic bottles
- Milk jugs
- Laundry detergent & softener jugs
- Plastic bags, clean plastic wrap & bubble wrap (bundle into one plastic bag, tie closed)
- Yogurt & margarine containers, plastic cups

Tin & Aluminum:

- CLEAN metal & aluminum cans, lids
- CLEAN Trays, plates

- ◇ REMOVE LIDS & CAPS
- ◇ CLEAN OFF FOOD RESIDUE
- ◇ LABELS CAN BE LEFT ON
- ◇ FLATTEN BOXES

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Styrofoam/foam cups (even if they have recycling symbol!); scrap metals or wood; batteries and electronics; plasticized, waxed or laminated material; tissues & paper towel; light bulbs, mirrors, ceramics, window glass or Pyrex; hazardous or bio-hazardous materials
