What We Do
Our team provides holistic care for individuals with substance use disorder that includes:

- Timely Assessment and same-day prescriptions (e.g. Buprenorphine, Naltrexone)
- Virtual Appointments with physicians, nurses, and counsellors
- Screening for general health care concerns, including access to routine screening and preventive services
- Brief Counselling and connection to community supports
- Stabilization and transition to local care when possible
- Culturally-safe and trauma informed care for all clients

What is VAAM?
The virtual access to addiction medicine (VAAM) program offers seamless access to prescribers, nurses and addiction counsellors for Saskatchewan residents, ensuring they receive life-saving medications and treatments.

Who Can Access VAAM?
Individuals can call the VAAM program directly to connect with supports. No medical referral is necessary.

VAAM is open to individuals who:

- Live in Saskatchewan
- Are 18 years or older
- Want help with opioid, alcohol, stimulant, or benzodiazepine use
- Are open to discussing treatment options, including medication
- Do not have a prescriber for their addiction concerns

YOUR BLUE RECYCLE BINS

Do not place garbage or other non-recyclable items in your blue recycle bin. Refer to the list of recyclable and non-recyclable items below. IF YOU ARE UNCERTAIN IF AN ITEM IS RECYCLABLE, ERR ON THE SIDE OF CAUTION AND THROW IT IN THE GARBAGE! The ENTIRE TRUCK LOAD will be REJECTED if there is even one non-recyclable item in the load.

Space is required for the truck to pick up your bins; when placing bins on street, leave room for pickup. Do not place your bin close to another bin or beside a vehicle. In order for your garbage or recycling to be picked up by the Greenland truck, your items must be neatly **INSIDE** the bin, with the lid **CLOSED**. You **CANNOT** have bags on top of the bin or beside it. The driver will not get out to toss garbage into the truck. Your bin will not be picked up/dumped if there is garbage on the lid.

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS CAN BE PLACED IN YOUR BLUE BIN OR IN THE RECYCLE BINS LOCATED AT THE PORCUPINE TRANSFER STATION:

Paper & Cardboard:

- Flattened cardboard
- Phone Books, paper (not tied in bundles), paper bags
- Newspapers, letters, envelopes (incl. window), greeting cards, non-foil gift wrap, paper gift bags
- Milk & juice cartons
- Egg cartons
- Magazines, brochures, catalogs (remove plastic wrap)
- Paper drinking cups, soup containers (no foam)
- Bagged shredded paper

Plastics #2-7:

- Shampoo, conditioner bottles
- Plastic clamshell trays
- Plastic bottles
- Milk jugs
- Laundry detergent & softener jugs
- Plastic bags, clean plastic wrap & bubble wrap (bundle into one plastic bag, tie closed)
- Yogurt & margarine containers, plastic cups

Tin & Aluminum:

- CLEAN metal & aluminum cans, lids
- CLEAN Trays, plates

- ◇ REMOVE LIDS & CAPS
- ◇ CLEAN OFF FOOD RESIDUE
- ◇ LABELS CAN BE LEFT ON
- ◇ FLATTEN BOXES

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Styrofoam/foam cups (even if they have recycling symbol!); scrap metals or wood; batteries and electronics; plasticized, waxed or laminated material; tissues & paper towel; light bulbs, mirrors, ceramics, window glass or Pyrex; hazardous or bio-hazardous materials

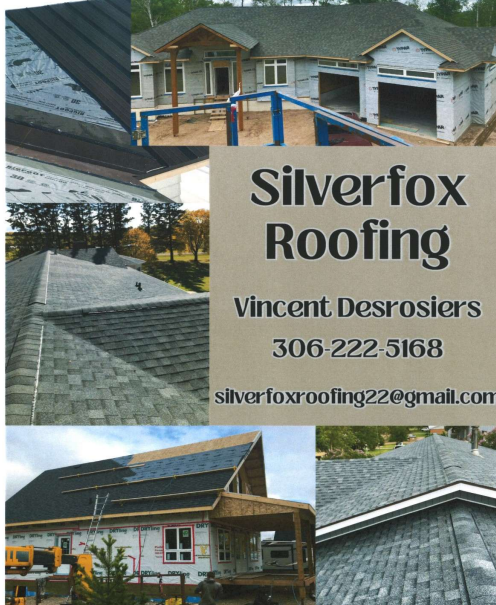
